- 1:1 Individualised Case Management

BEST Options is a fee for service community stream offering programs to people that are:

- Individualised Support Package Eligible
- Attending Secondary College – may be in last year of school or at risk of leaving prematurely
- Secondary Schools / Businesses
- Youth / Community Services Participants
- General Community
- Disability / Specific Learning Needs

BEST Futures is funded by the Department of Human Services to provide individualised support to young people with a disability aged between 18–21 years who are transitioning from school into education, training, employment and community options.

Participants are provided with a case management service whereby our consultant will work with each individual on a 1:1 basis to support them to plan, prepare and reach their future goals in the following areas:

- pre-employment skills and training
- employment (open and supported)
- work experience and volunteer work
- education and training
- on the job training
- personal development
- driver education (L's and P's)
- travel training
- budgeting
- social activities
- group programs (see back of brochure for more details)

To be eligible for this three year program participants will need to:

- have a diagnosed disability
- have attended a specialist school setting or received integration support at secondary school
- be aged between 18-21 years
- finished Year 12 or will not enrol in the following year at school

BEST Futures can also provide support and information to employers in:

- Disability Awareness training
- Providing information in employing a person with a disability
- 1:1 on the job support
- Incentive and employment schemes (DAAWS and SWS)
